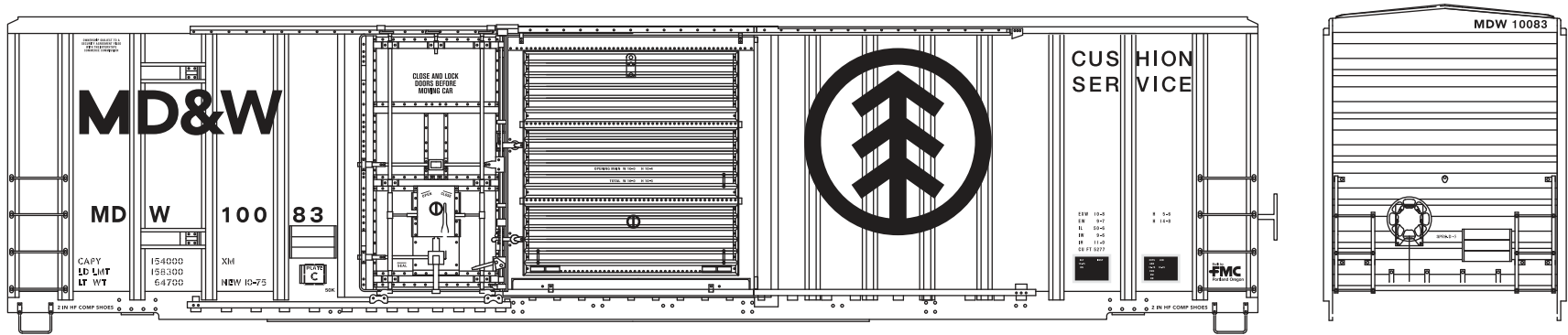


Sharing many characteristics in terms of paint and lettering, IBT (International Bridge and Terminal) along with the MD&W (Minnesota Dakota & Western) are both subsidiaries of Boise Cascade. Due to that, the colors are consistent as well as both companies share the pine tree logo developed by Boise Cascade. Throughout the 70s to the 80s these cars were placed into paper hauling service. There were subtle paint scheme differences. Some cars were repainted in solid green with reporting marks and Data only (FMC cars with a 12' plug, and modern 60' cars). Other cars are Green with white plug doors (mainly spotted on 10' plug door cars) while others are solid green and have large billboard logos. Be sure to check against photos to find out how to letter your boxcar appropriately.
