

Vertical stripe up front of nose continues down the length of the top of the nose to the cab windows,

For the black stripe that goes around the bottom edge of the red painted areas, use the 2" stripe from Microscale decal set 87-124-2 in HO, 60-124-2 in N-scale and, in O-scale, use the 3" stripe (that's the HO dimension) on Microscale decal 87-110-2.

These large side-mounted number boards were lighted. We have provided decals that will allow for this. If you are not lighting these number boards, apply the white rectangular decal before applying the number board decal so the numbers appear white. We have also included the silver frame to decal over the red, yellow and black striping.


This drawing represents the "as delivered" version of the Santa Fe Alco PA-1 scheme. These engines were delivered with the longer "Santa Fe" lettering on the side of the engine, silver numbers and "F" next to the builder's plate under the cab and the sansserif numbers in the roof-mounted number board centered above the cab. When new, these engines also featured a stainless steel grille surrounding the Mars light (the upper headlight opening).

RED (Accupaint AP-69, Floquil 110176, Modelflex 16-31, Polly Scale 414149, Scalecoat 26, Scalecoat II 2026):

Cab, nose, stripe down side of unit.

SILVER (Accupaint AP-40, Floquil 110100, Modelflex 16-32, Polly Scale 414143, Scalecoat 23, Scalecoat II 2023):

Sides, roof, pilot, rear, skirt, trim above cab, grabirons, steps, step kick plates, truck sideframes.



These drawings show the lettering changes that appeared on Santa Fe's PA-1 and PB-1 diesels following renumbering and repainting. Notable changes include slightly shorter "Santa Fe" lettering on the side of the engine, black numbers and "F" next to the builder's plate under the cab, a black "Water" stencil in the red stripe above the rear truck and the Roman style numbers in the roof-mounted number board centered above the cab. The original stainless steel grille surrounding the Mars light (the upper headlight opening) has now been painted yellow.
