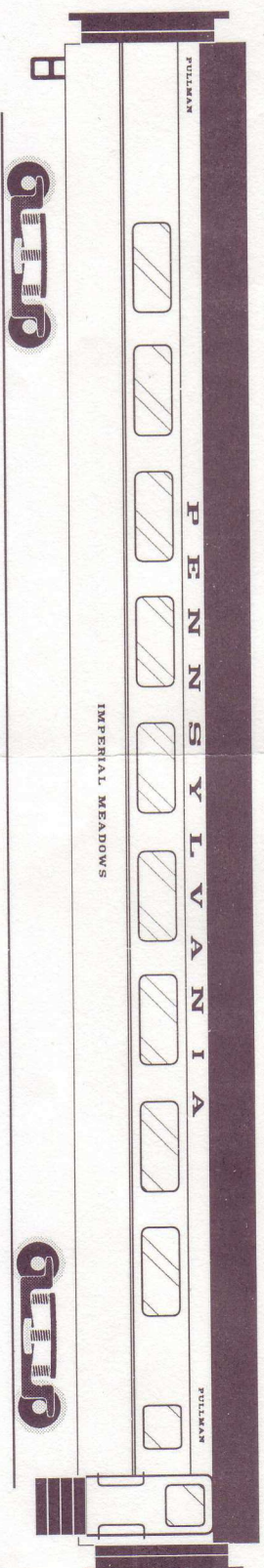
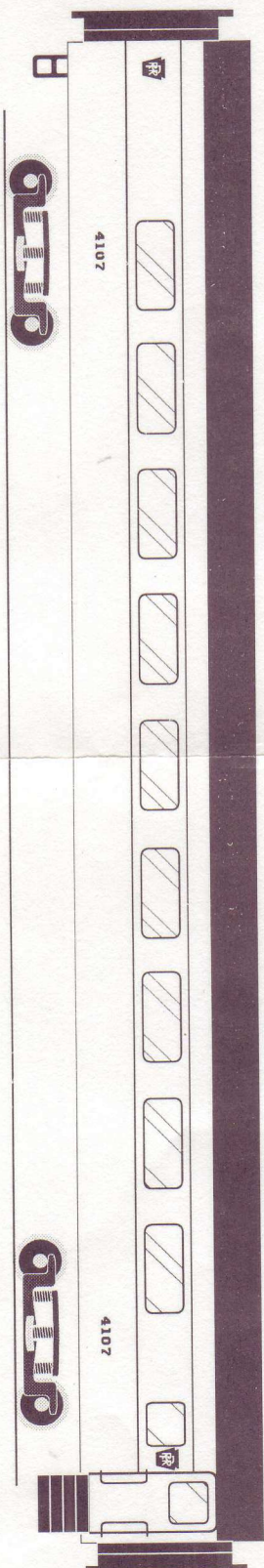
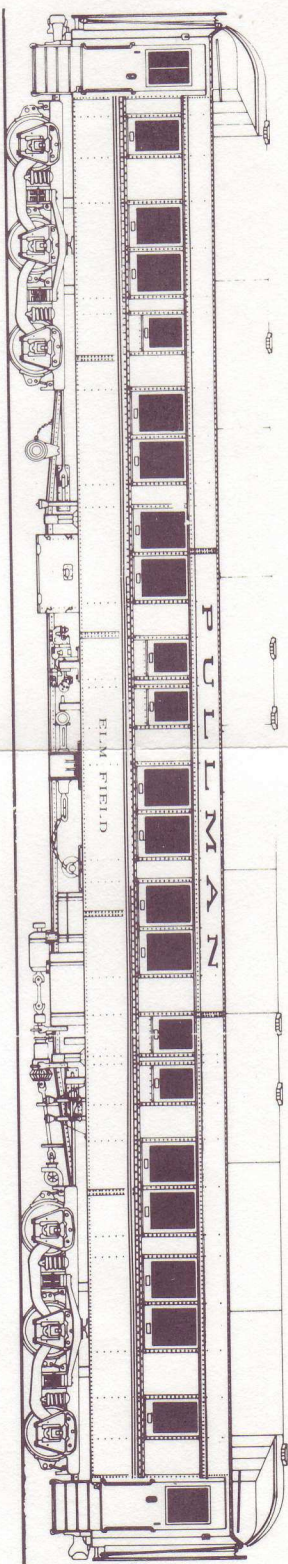


COLOR: TUSCAN; BADGER ACCU FLEX LIGHT TUSCAN OXIDE RED

SIDES AND ENDS ARE PAINTED TUSCAN RED.
ROOF, TRUCKS AND UNDERBODY ARE BLACK.

FROM 1947 TO MID 1963 CARS HAD ONE STRIPE ABOVE THE WINDOWS AND TWO STRIPES BELOW THE WINDOWS.
STRIPES DID NOT CONTINUE ACROSS DOORS. IN 1963 THE ROAD NAME PENNSYLVANIA WAS DROPPED FROM
THE SIDES OF THE CAR AND REPLACED WITH TWO KEYSTONE LOGOS IN THE WINDOW PANEL AT EACH END OF
THE CAR. THE STRIPING WAS ALSO CHANGED AT THIS TIME TO ONE STRIPE ABOVE AND BELOW THE WINDOWS.
HEAD END CARS (BAGGAGE, RPO, ETC.) NEVER RECEIVED STRIPES.
